

Amazon Labor Union

The Amazon Labor Union (ALU) is an independent, worker-led, labor union for Amazon employees. The ALU was founded on April 20, 2021, by a labor activist group known as The Congress of Essential Workers (TCOEW), co-founded by current and former Amazon warehouse workers Chris Smalls, Derrick Palmer, Gerald Bryson, and Jordan Flowers.

Following their election on April 1, 2022, the workers at JFK8 in Staten Island, New York, became the first unionized Amazon workers recognized by the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB). Since their victory, the ALU has been working with Amazon workers across the country on union campaigns and to build grassroots labor power.

"Every Amazon worker deserves to have a seat at the table. Our movement is about putting power back in the hands of Amazon workers and establishing our right to negotiate for a better, safer, and more equitable workplace," the Union's website states.

Los Deliveristas Unidos, Worker Justice Project

Los Deliveristas Unidos (LDU) is a collective of app delivery workers fighting for justice. LDU is a new organizing effort spawned by the Workers Justice Project to give this vulnerable group of gig workers access to basic rights, such as the right to use the bathroom and a minimum wage. The bitter truth is that many food delivery workers can work 12 hours a day in the cold or rain for multiple food service apps and still not make enough to feed their own families.

Many food workers lost their jobs when the restaurants that employed them were forced to close due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Their only option has been to work through a delivery app, such as GrubHub, DoorDash, Relay, and UberEats, among others. Today, New York City has as many as 65,000 app-based food delivery workers who continue to keep the city fed.

Ernesta Galvez is one of the leaders of Los Deliveristas Unidos (LDU), a division powered by Worker's Justice Project (WJP). Galvez worked in the service industry for many years, including distributing fliers, dry cleaning, and street vending. However, due to the unreliable earnings in these jobs and the lack of flexibility given to her, Galvez started delivering food more than five years ago.

During the pandemic, it became clear to Galvez that although delivery workers are essential to the economy, they are not treated as such. In 2021. Galvez met with the Worker's Justice Project/LDU's staff. She heard their goals in organizing delivery workers into Los Deliveristas Unidos, a worker-led movement fighting for better conditions, fair wages, and protections. Knowing what delivery workers were experiencing because of the apps, not only did she join WJP in the fight but also informed her network of this new movement. Galvez leads the Deliveristas Women Committee, giving a voice to women in this industry.

Ernesta Galvez is from Gurerro, Mexico, and has been in New York since 2004. She currently lives in Queens with her three children and is an active parent at their school.

Mamun Hossen is a 21-year-old delivery worker leader from Bangladesh. He currently works the night shift for Uber, routinely working from 6 p.m. to 4 a.m. in order to make a living wage and support his family back home. Mamun, as a leader for both the Deliveristas Unidos and Desis Rising Up and Moving (DRUM), has been integral in the collaboration and integration of both organizations. He has brought many Bangladeshi workers into the Deliveristas movement to receive help and build worker power. Representing Manhattan e-bike workers, Mamun has been committed to getting legal help for his community in accidents, advocating for higher wages, and fighting hard to get fellow deliveristas' accounts reactivated.



New York State Nurses Association

The New York State Nurses Association (NYSNA) is a union of more than 40,000 frontline nurses and health care professionals united for patients, safe staffing, health equity, the practice, and health care for all. NYSNA is New York's largest union and professional association for registered nurses.

Nursing is about more than healing individual patients. As a union of health care professionals and patient advocates, they address the broader social and economic issues that shape the public's health beyond the bedside. The COVID-19 pandemic laid bare what nurses have long known—inequitable funding, access, and delivery of health care have harmed patients and driven health care disparities in low-income communities and communities of color. The health care system has prioritized short-term profits over the health and safety of nursing staff, patients, and communities, leaving all ill-prepared to respond to health care crises, or adequately meet the nation's health care needs.

NYSNA's fight for health equity is a fight for social, racial, and economic justice. Their vision is for a health care system that prioritizes patients over profits, and where everyone can access quality, affordable care. They advocate for better working and patient care conditions, build the power of frontline health care workers, and take action with union, community, and elected allies fighting for a better health care system and a better world.

Karen Silkwood Award NYCOSH Staff (USW Local 4-406)

The New York Committee for Occupational Safety and Health (NYCOSH) is a membership organization of workers, unions, community-based organizations, workers' rights activists, and health and safety professionals. The staff at NYCOSH know how important it is for workers to have a safe, healthy, and fair wage workplace, which is why NYCOSH is involved in the campaigns of workers in the fight for better working conditions. NYCOSH staff are supported in their work and their mission by NYCOSH management, and the United Steelworkers Local 4-406, of which they are proud members.

The NYCOSH staff—a team of health and safety specialists, program coordinators, industrial hygiene, and administrative staff—strive to empower workers to create safer workplaces through a combination of training, technical assistance, and advocacy. NYCOSH work takes many forms.

- The NYCOSH staff supports nail salon workers in the New York Nail Salon School through all the steps of obtaining their license—from the knowledge and training necessary to employ safer work practices at the salon through preparation for the state exam.
- NYCOSH staff provides training to immigrant workers to ensure they are aware of their rights on the job. NYCOSH staff coordinates and trains day laborers and immigrant construction workers through its Construction Safety School, ensuring they have the knowledge to stay safe on the job, and helping put workers on the path to obtaining their Site Safety Training Cards, which is a mandatory requirement for construction workers in New York City.

- NYCOSH staff conducts sessions for workers and organizations to obtain their OSHA 10 and OSHA 30 trainings, frequently coordinating those efforts with organizations such as Non-Traditional Employment for Women (NEW) and Sustainable South Bronx. Staff also provides disaster preparedness training to community-based organizations and Latino consulates. Every autumn, NYCOSH staff provides a series of short trainings to high school students in the BOCES program in Long Island to prepare them for the potential safety hazards they may encounter.
- NYCOSH program coordinators work in partnership with the Manhattan Justice for Workers Collaborative (MJWC) to coordinate efforts to increase crime-reporting for victims of wage theft and negligent health and safety practices.
- NYCOSH also coordinates with the WTC Health Program to assist 9/11 responders and survivors in obtaining their health care benefits.
- In addition to training and program assistance, NYCOSH staff also assists workers with technical questions, both by providing resources and information, as well as by conducting workplace visits and on-site assessments.
- During the pandemic, NYCOSH staff shifted a lot of its work remotely, and have been able to virtually train and empower hundreds of workers who were not able to travel to the NYCOSH office due to either immigration confinement, illness or disability, or the need to care for family members.
- Outside of NYCOSH, several of the staff continue to teach both workers and future leaders in occupational safety through courses at the Harry Van Arsdale, Jr. School for Labor Studies of Empire State College and CUNY School of Labor Studies.
